ALDERSON NAMED TOP COACH West's Fleming, Gore Share County Player Of Year Honors

West Brunswick rising seniors Bryan Fleming and Scott Gore share Brunswick County Prep 1002 Baseball Player of the Year honors after leading the Trojans to one of their best seasons in school history.

The powerful catcher and crafty pitcher got the job done in the field and at the plate this spring as West advanced to the eastern finals of the state 2-A playoffs.



Fleming and Gore both play American Legion ball for Brunswick Shores Post 445 and are competing on the Region 2 baseball team at the N.C. State Games this week in Chapel Hill.

Fleming, a catcher who has played on the varsity level since his freshman year, led the team in hitting, home runs and RBI this year and displayed strong leadership qualities.

"Bryan runs the show out there," said West Brunswick Coach Mike Alderson, who was chosen county coach of the year after guiding his

club to a 17-7 record in his third year at the helm.

"I'd say he's one of the top three catchers in this region, and the best catcher in the Waccamaw 2-A Conference" Alderson said.

Fleming, an all-county selection his freshman and sophomore years. posted impressive numbers at the plate this spring. He batted .354 with five home runs and 23 RBI.

"He had a great season," Alderson said. "When he hits it, he hits it. He doesn't get cheated up there. He gets his money's worth."

Gore, who was named most improved player on the West Brunswick squad, was Fleming's battery mate for about half of the Trojans' games this season.

The right-handed pitcher posted an 8-3 record on the mound this season, leading the team with an ERA of 1.14 and 95 strike outs.

Gore also hit .318 for West Brunswick, while throwing a pair of two-hitters, one one-hitter and one no-hitter.

Mixing fastballs and curves all season, Gore won state playoff games over Ayden-Grifton and C.B. Aycock.

"He had a really big year on the mound for us," Alderson said. 'Scott was one of the big reasons we went as far as we did in the playoffs.'

Other pitchers include Jared McGee of North Brunswick, a versatile player who started, relieved and played shortstop for Coach Keith Moore's Scorpions.

McGee was 4-3 as a pitcher with a 1.49 ERA. He hit .290 with three home runs and 24 RBI.

Representing South Brunswick on the all-county pitching staff are Brett Tabor and Rodney Willoughby, who fired a no-hitter early in the season.

Infielders

Infielders other than Fleming named to the all-county team include three players from South Brunswick who hit over .300 this spring.

Second baseman Mike Brogan, shortstop Eric McMahan and catcher Mike Clewis each hit around .330 for the Cougars.

Also named to the team was West Brunswick junior Keane Bellamy, who alternated at second base and shortstop for the Trojans.

Despite a tough year in the field, Bellamy had some key hits for the Trojans, including the game-winner in the third round of the state playoffs against East Bladen.

North Brunswick additions to the all-Brunswick County outfield are Adrian Black and Demetrius Bell.

Black led the Scorpions in hitting in 1992 with a .292 average. Bell was a .289 hitter with five doubles and one triple. He also stole eight bases for the Scorpions.

Rounding out the all-county outfield is South Brunswick's Jason Bracey, who was a .320 hitter for the Cougars.

Selections to the all-county team are made by sports writers for The Brunswick Beacon and State Port Pilot newspapers, with nominations from coaches.
