\$5,500 In Stolen Property **Recovered In November**

stolen property was recovered by the Brunswick County Sheriff's Department during September, according to a monthly officers' activity report released by Sheriff John Davis.

Deputies and detectives made a total of 26 arrests as prosecuting witness.

A total of 1,607 calls were answered, including 183 domestic calls, and 456 investigations were made. Deputies found seven doors

An estimated \$5,500 worth of or windows open the report said Deputies served 481 civil papers and summoned 112 witnesses. Eleven mental and inebriate papers were served, along with 23 foreign

warrants. More than 104,225 miles were logged, including 29 trips out of the county. The department used a total of 8,896 gallons of gasoline.

Sheriff's personnel spent 14 offduty hours in court and 43 on-duty hours. There were 41 crime prevention meetings.
