A 69-year-old Shallotte woman told police that someone broke into her mobile home, entered her bedroom and attempted to rape her early Sunday morning, according to a crime report on file at the Brunswick Sheriff's Department County Monday.

The woman told Deputy Phil Bryant that she was awakened at about 1:30 by someone in her room who was rubbing her legs and feeling her breast.

Bryant's report quotes the intruder as saying to the woman, "You are so pretty. I need you and I got to have you."

The victim said she started screaming and "probably hit the assailant with a flashlight," Bryant reported. The man then ran out the door and left.

No arrest had been made Monday. An investigation is continuing.

In other crime reports on file at the sheriff's department Monday: A Leland man said he was standing outside a local bar when someone hit him in the mouth and the back of the head, knocking him out Sunday night. The victim told Detective Charlie Miller that "he did not see the suspect hit him. All he remembers is waking up in New Hanover Hospital." The man said he had been talking to his attacker and did not think there were any problems. The victim told Miller that the other man had been drinking.

Two men said someone fired a rifle at them while they were riding three-wheeled recreational vehicles in the Sandy Creek area Saturday afternoon, Deputy Cathy Hamilton reported. The men said they were riding near under the power lines off U.S. 74-76 when a woman stepped out of her mobile home and asked them to stop. As the two men approached the trailer, they said someone started shooting at them from a nearby field. The woman yelled a warning and the two rode off.

Someone stole a \$3,000 gasolinepowered brick saw from the T.A. Loving Company on U.S. 17 Thursday night. An employee reported the theft to Deputy Randy Robinson Friday morning. No other information was given in the report. A man who claimed to be having a seizure, but was later determined to be drunk, was blamed for causing

He looked outside to see a man behind the wheel of a small camper. "The subject advised him he was having a seizure and for him to call 911," the report said. Rescue workers later determined the man had been drinking.
