The girls' championship game starts at 6 p.m. and will be followed by the boys' final at 7:15 p.m., said County Schools Athletic Director Nelson Best.


On Monday, South Brunswick Middle's boys and girls advanced to the finals with wins over Shallotte Middle School.

Also Thursday, certificates will be awarded to members of the allcounty teams selected by coaches.




