# South Boys Edge Hoggard

Scooter Moore's layup with four seconds remaining gave South Brunswick a surprising, 42-41 win over Wilmington Hoggard in a nonconference high school boys' basketball game last Friday.

Senior point guard Antoine Johnson led South Brunswick with Lewis, 6; King, 6; Gaddy, 6; Smith, 12 points, and Moore and Chris Champion finished with eight each. Chris Kiger paced the Vikings with 16 points South Brunswick led 28-23 at halftime, but the host Vikings held the Cougars to just five points in the third quarter and took a 35-33 lead into the final period. Moore's late basket snapped a two-game losing streak for South Brunswick and helped avenge a 74-67 loss to the Vikings earlier this season in Boiling Spring Lakes. South Brunswick also improved its overall record to 5-11. The Vikings dropped to 11-6. The win was a positive ending to a disappointing week for the Cougars. Junior forward Mike Clark was lost for the season due to an injury sustained in a hunting accident last Monday. Clark, who had been averaging 10 points and seven rebounds per game, accidentally shot his middle toe.

# Dowe, Cox Lead **NMB** Chiefs Past West Lady Trojans

BY DOUG RUTTER The inside-outside combination of Ferry Dowe and Teka Cox led North Myrtle Beach to a 54-40 victory over West Brunswick in a non-conference high school girls' basketball

game Saturday in Shallotte. Cox nailed three three-pointers in the first four minutes and finished with a game-high 20 points. Dowe, the Lady Chiefs' center, scored most

of her 14 points in the paint. Freshman Donicia Moody scored 13 points and senior Nicole Norris added 11 to lead West Brunswick, which trailed the whole game and never got closer than six points in the second half.

"We knew it would be a tough game," North Myrtle Beach Coach Frank Moorehead said. "We got blown out here last year. We knew we would have to play hard for four quarters.

The Lady Chiefs came out firing as Cox drained three three-pointers from the right corner to give her team a quick 9-3 lead.

Moorehead said Cox's hot shooting was important because Dowe and backup center Kurtura Berkley were in foul trouble for much of the game.

"She knocked in a couple threes right at the start and that really helped her confidence," Moorehead said. "West Brunswick has some good perimeter shooters and they trapped us well."

North Myrtle Beach led 13-5 after one quarter and used a 6-0 run early in the second period to take a 19-7 lead with 6:45 left in the first half.

Cox scored 13 of her 20 points in the opening half.

West Brunswick outscored the visitors 8-2 in the last 5 1/2 minutes of the half to cut the Lady Chiefs' lead to 21-15 at intermission.

North Myrtle Beach opened the second half with three inside baskets to extend its lead to 27-15, but West responded with a 6-0 run of its own to cut the lead back to six points at the 3:19 mark of the third quarter.

The Lady Chiefs came right back with a 9-0 spurt that included Cox' fourth three-pointer of the night.

North Myrtle Beach carried a 36-23 lead into the fourth quarter. West Brunswick cut the lead to nine points on three occasions but couldn't draw any closer.

The Lady Chiefs improved their record to 15-6, while West Brunswick's girls fell to 7-11 overall.


North Myrtle Beach's win completed a season sweep of West Brunswick. The Lady Chiefs had posted a 61-55 win on their home floor Jan. 7.

# Leland MiddleSets Faculty Basketball Game Feb. 16


Leland Middle School will hold its second annual faculty basketball game Wednesday, Feb. 16, at 7 p.m. in the school gym.
