## Whiteville's Wolfpack Beats South Cougars

Anthony Pridden pitched a complete-game, four-hitter to lead Whiteville to a 5-1 win over host South Brunswick last Friday night in high school baseball.

Mark Koenig and Anthony Southern each had two-run singles for the Wolfpack, which improved to 4-0 in the Waccamaw Conference and 9-2 overall. Pridden (3-1) struck out two and walked one.

Jerry Galloway suffered the loss for South Brunswick, which committed four errors. The Cougars fell to 0-2 in the conference and 5-7 overall.

In Waccamaw Conference action last Tuesday, East Columbus pitcher John Junious hurled a one-hitter as the Gators rolled to an 11-1 victory over South Brunswick at Lake Waccamaw.

Lewis Vaught tripled and scored in the second inning for the Cougars' only offense. Pitcher Brian Ricker took the loss for South Brunswick, which committed six errors.

East Columbus broke a 1-1 tie with four runs in the fourth inning. The Gators added two more in the fifth and four in the sixth before the game was stopped under the 10-run rule.

Junious struck out seven batters and also had a double. Kelly Bass

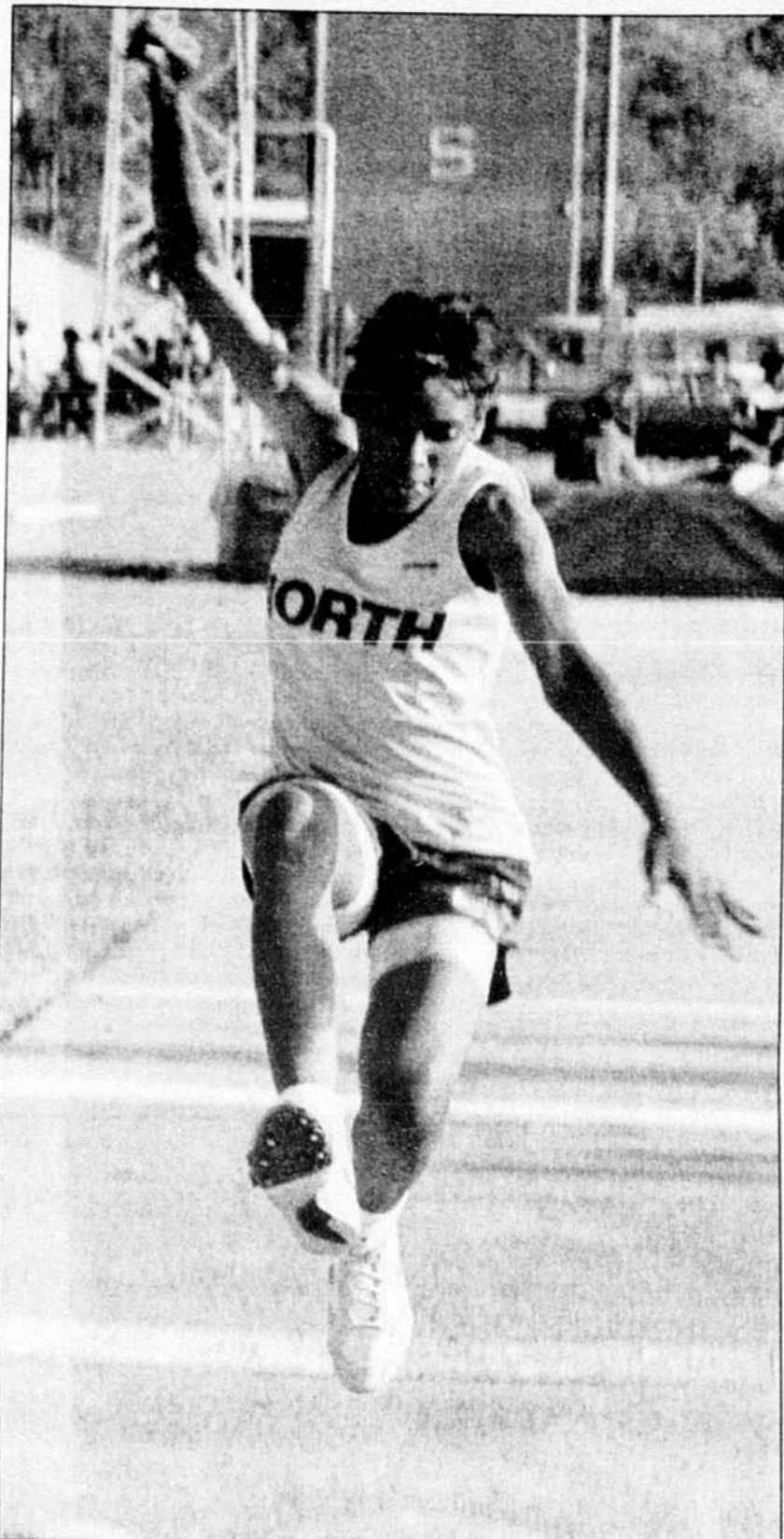
went 3-for-3 with a double and two RBI as the Gators improved to 2-0 in the Waccamaw Conference and 6-5 overall.
