## Hot-Line For Reporting Abuse Or Waste Of State Resources In Service

State Auditor Edward Renfrow recently announced plans to implement a "hot-line" effective July 1 to report fraud, waste or abuse of state resources. Mr. Renfrow said, "As State Auditor, it is my duty to constantly seek improved methods of discovering instances of fraud, waste, or abuse involving state funds, property or state employees' time. My staff is specifically instructed to be alert for such instances of potential or actual wrongdoing or mismanagement. Beginning in July we will also have in place a telephone line in the State Auditor's Office specifically designated to receive calls from state employees and citizens who wish to report instances of fraud, waste or abuse. I have discussed this hot-line with

Governor Martin and the legislative leadership and all are very supportive of the concept." Auditor Renfrow continued, "The hot-line will provide a safe means whereby those who observe abuses can report them without fear of placing their careers in jeopardy. Abusive practices diminish the resources we all have to do our jobs and their elimination is, therefore, in the best interest of state employees as well as taxpayers." The hot-line number is (919) 733-3276. It will be answered between the hours of 8:00 am and 5:00 pm Monday through Friday by designated personnel. The caller will receive a report number in the event he learns of more information or calls again to learn of the status of the report.

Auditor Renfrow said, "My staff will review all reports and determine whether or not the allegation is of a serious nature. We will ask the agency involved to respond to allegation(s) of a minor nature and report back to us. If the allegation(s) is serious in nature, we will assign the appropriate staff to investigate and report back. In accordance with G.S. 147-64.6 (c) (12), we will inform the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General and

Speaker of the House of serious allegations." Mr. Renfrow stated that while the initial hot-line will be a local number only, a statewide toll-free line may be installed at a later date. He stated, "I am committed to fiscal responsibility and fiscal accountability in state government. I am excited about this new hot-line project and believe it will become an important tool in the State Auditor's Office to identify fraud, waste and abuse."

## CP&L Constructing Aurora Substation

Carolina Power and Light Company is planning to install a substation near Aurora at the intersection of Highway 33 and 306 S. Company spokesman Robert McCarn said that this sub-station is being built to improve service to the customers in the area. Presently, the land is being prepared for construction which is

scheduled to begin next year. McCarn said that the sub-station or switching station will consist of transformer switches and other high powered hardware.
