SAUSAGE—SOUTHERN STYLE

Pat out sausage meat in a baking dish, having the meat about 1 inch deep. Bake in a hot oven (400 degrees F.) about 20 minutes. Drain off excess fat. Cover top with a rich biscuit dough, rolled out very thin, and score in squares convenient for serving. Bake in a very hot oven (425 deg.
