ORDER AUTHORIZING \$500,000.00 BONDS FOR REFUNDING ROAD AND BRIDGE BONDS OF PERQUIMANS COUNTY

Be it resolved and ordered by the Board of County Commissioners of Perquimans County:

1. That Bonds of Perquimans County be issued pursuant to the County Finance Act, as amended, in an amount not exceeding \$500,000.00 for the purpose of refunding a like amount of principal of valid subsisting indebtedness of the county, which indebtedness was incurred prior to July 1st, 1933 for building and rebuilding roads and bridges in said county and is evidenced by the following:

1960, \$15,000 in the year 1961, \$16,000 in the year 1962, \$18,000 in the year 1963, \$18,000 in the year 1964, \$18,000 in the year 1965, \$18,000 in the year 1966, \$19,000 in the year 1967, \$20,000 in the year 1968, \$20,000 in the year 1969, and \$20,000 in the year 1970. said bonds redeemable at option of the county at any interest payment period.

2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds when due shall be annually levied and collected.

3. That a statement of the county debt has been filed with the Clerk and is open to public inspection.

4. That this order shall take effect from its passage and shall not be submitted to the voters.

The Board thereupon designated W. F. C. Edwards, County Accountant, as the officer whose duty it should be to file with the Clerk the statement of debt and assessed valuation required by the County Finance Act to be filed before the final passage of the Bond Order this day introduced.

Thereupon the County Accountant filed with the Clerk in the presence of the Board the statement of debt and assessed valuation required by Section 14 of the County Finance Act.

The order authorizing \$500,000.00 Bonds was passed on first reading.

Thereupon the Board fixed 10 o'clock A. M. Monday, April 6th, 1936, as the hour and date for the public hearing as required by Section 16 of the County Finance Act and directed the Clerk to publish the Bond Order which has been introduced this day together with the appended note as required by said Section 16, in The Perquimans Weekly, not later than the 10th day before the date so fixed.

NOTE

The foregoing order has been introduced and a sworn statement has been filed under the County Finance Act showing the assessed valuation of the County to be \$5,526,799.00 and the net debt for other than school purposes, including the proposed bond issue to be \$522,000.00. A tax will be levied for the payment of the proposed bonds and interest, if the same shall be issued. Any citizen or taxpayer may protest against the issuance of such bonds at a meeting of the Board of County Commissioners to be held at 10 o'clock A. M. on Monday, April 6th, 1936, or an adjournment thereof.
