## TRAVELING LIGHT

IT'S a "sissy" load this particular cargador is carrying—a real load consists of a dozen or so chairs, or a two-hundred-pound pig. These carriers are among the most amazing sights to be seen by travelers visiting Guatemala on the fortnightly cruises to San Jose.

The cargador will tackle just about anything—bathrooms, mattresses, coffins, pianos, a load of a half-dozen tables, or three or four dozen huge earthen jars, a pile of lumber or fragile glassware and vegetables enough to fill a garden. Any of these loads may be seen with two trotting legs underneath joggling along the highways.

Sometimes the carrier packs his load in a woven net, but usually in a canteen, a wooden frame suspended from a tumpine with a headpiece fitted to the forehead against which he braces himself. The tilt thus given to the body and the rapid dog-trot pace are part of the trick of balancing the load—a trick which the Indians learn very early in life. The cargador can average about fifteen miles a day with his peculiar dog trot, carrying a load of seventy-five or a hundred pounds. And so accustomed is he to bracing himself against this weight that, on the return journey, if there's no cargo, he substitutes rocks.

## Farsighted, Nearsighted

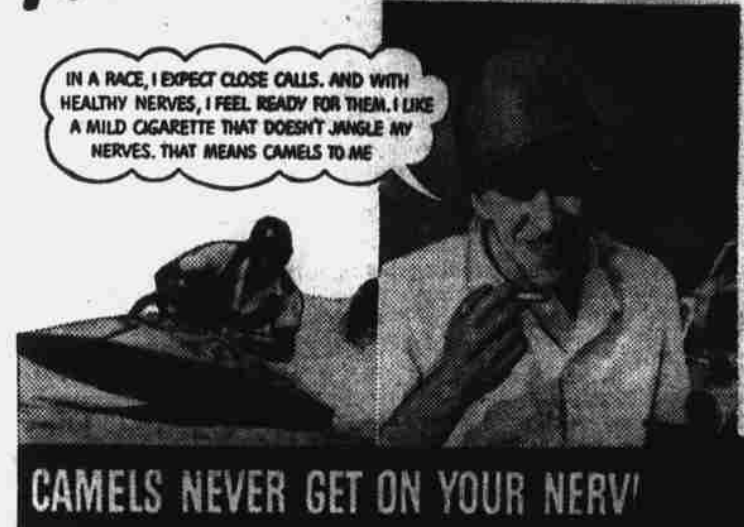
