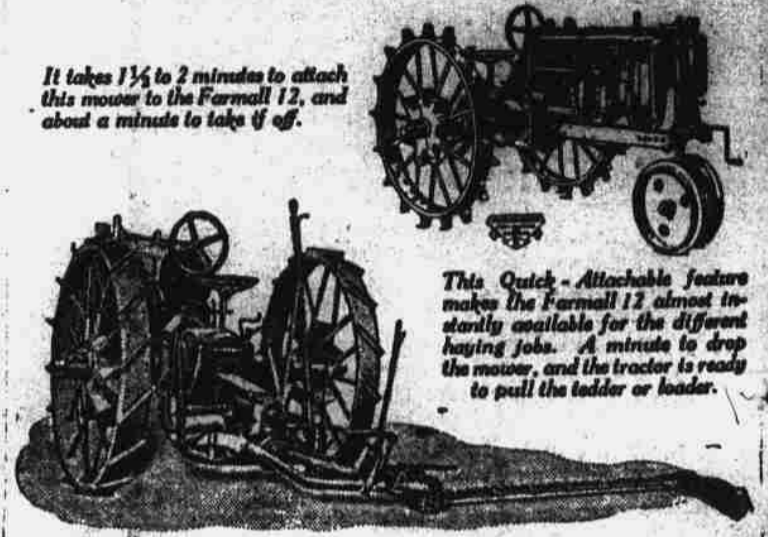
HOSTESS TO BRIDGE CLUB
