JAMES S. McNIDER RESIGNS AS JUDGE RECORDER'S COURT

The resigning judge said that since the new recorder had been an applicant for the position at the January resignation of Walter H. Oakey, Jr., and whose application had been turned down by the Commissioners who appointed himself to fill the vacancy, and in view of Saturday's evidence that the people favored Mr. Tucker, he considered the fair thing to do was to step down and let the Commissioners appoint the people's choice.

So the high position of county judge, which has been twice resigned in less than the course of one term, passed on into new hands. Mr. Tucker will fill out the unexpired term and then take office again in December as an officer elected by the people. Mr. McNider did not choose to exercise his rights to ask for a run-off, automatically giving Mr. Tucker the position of high man in Saturday's election.

Mr. McNider's resignation read as follows: "In view of the recent public expression of the desire that Mr. Granbery Tucker serve as judge of recorder's court, and in view of my desire for harmony in our local government, I hereby tender you my resignation as judge of the recorder's court to take effect immediately, and I take this occasion to acknowledge my gratefulness to you in the honor you conferred in your interim appointment of me in that capacity."

owners who were not prompt in bringing their dogs forward for the treatment. The penalty is added to the cost of the inoculation.

After notification by the deputy, three days grace are allowed in which to have the un inoculated animals treated. If the untreated dog is still not brought forward a warrant is issued. After court proceedings, according to the inspector, upon conviction the violator is subject to a fine of not less than ten dollars or ten days in jail, and not more than fifty dollars or thirty days in jail, as set by State law.

To avoid confusion in checking up on the treated and untreated animals, G. C. Buck has agreed to discontinue his activities in the rabies vaccinations, leaving the work entirely to Mr. Nobles.
