The crops of the county were in good shape. Needed rain had brought joy to the hearts of Perquimans farmers and cotton blooms had been reported from the Brinn Farm and from the farm of T. W. Nixon. Crops in the neighborhood of New Hope were recovering from the effects of a severe hail storm.

The infantile paralysis epidemic had reached the Albemarle when a colored child in Edenton was stricken on the preceding Friday. Seventeen additional cases had been reported over the week-end to swell the State's total. Parents were being warned to keep their children at home.

Funds were being sought for the erection of two new school buildings, brick structures at Winfall and Belvidere.
