year terms of office for the sheriffs and coroners of North Carolina. Already the clerks of Superior Court and the registers of deeds are elected for four years, and I can see no reason why this same provision should not apply to the sheriffs and coroners. I believe it will make for efficiency in public service," the Governor stated.

Senator Larkins said he has received a number of endorsements of the amendment from solicitors, judges, business men of the State, congressmen and State representatives.

It is thought that Sheriff J. Emmett Winslow also favors the four year term.
