

A Northerner Has Found The South; He Wishes He Hadn't

J. Levinton Errs; Tried, Convicted and Pays; All In Less Than Four Hours

Touring is an expensive hobby, and the fruits of justice can ripen rapidly when courts of law are so inclined. These two thoughts are probably with Mr. J. Levinton today as he looks in the sun on some Florida strand.

Mr. Levinton is of the first opinion because the portion of his southward journey from Winfall to Hertford cost him well upwards to a hundred dollars.

He has drawn the second conclusion because last Friday afternoon at four o'clock his car became involved in a minor collision with a car driven by Edward Purefoy, of Edenton. A short time later Mr. Levinton was in Williamston, continuing his southward journey, and then in less than another hour he was back in Hertford answering charges of reckless driving and leaving the scene of an accident.

In another two hours the special term of county court called in Mr. Levinton's honor, had adjourned and Mr. Levinton had paid out monies amounting to slightly less than one hundred dollars and was again on his way to the land of eternal sunshine.

According to the evidence given before Recorder Granberry Tucker, the Levinton car, bearing Mr. and Mrs. Levinton and Mr. and Mrs. Morris Handel of New Jersey, passed

the Purefoy car at a high rate of speed on the highway just north of Hertford. Almost too late Mr. Levinton noted a mule and cart in his path and quickly applied the brakes. So quickly that Purefoy's car crashed into the rear of the sumptuous Levinton sedan and bounded thence into the ditch.

No one was injured, but both cars were damaged, Levinton's not to the extent but that he could drive on... so he drove on.

He drove on to Williamston, where the long arm of police radio law halted him and delivered the four tourists back to Hertford where warrants were served instead of supper. Though it was time for supper now.

Local legal talent gathered quickly in the courtroom; Attorney C. H. Holmes, summoned from his home where he was doing some chores around the house, arrived in overalls to represent Purefoy. Solicitor Chas. E. Johnson was there to handle the prosecution and Attorney W. G. Edwards represented the defendants.

Evidence was lengthy on both sides and harried housewives tried in vain to keep supper warm for husbands who preferred to miss the evening meal rather than miss any part of the fiery hearing.

Recorder Tucker found Mr. Levinton guilty of reckless driving. The fine and costs amounted to \$42.75, and no sooner was the case finished than a writ of attachment ordered Levinton's car held until damage claims to the Purefoy car had been settled.

Mr. Levinton waived a civil hearing, and another amount was added to his expenditures for the day, bringing the total to \$97.75, the compromise and attorney fee.

So Mr. Levinton today is probably lolling on the beach, mulling over the ways of fate, and as he told Deputy Sheriff M. G. Owens, mapping out a route back northward in order to avoid Hertford "even if I have to drive 500 miles out of the way."

Chevrolet Smashes All January Records

Chevrolet dealers' sales of new cars and trucks in the month of January totaled 73,328 units, a figure which smashes all January records, with the exception of a single year. The announcement was made at the company's headquarters in Detroit.

Sales for the month showed a gain of 21,326 units, or 41 per cent, over those for January 1939. Sales for the final 10 days totaled 25,915 units, as compared with 14,843 in the same period last year.

The records show that in only one other January—January 1936—has the record of the past month been equalled, and the sales in January of that million-Chevrolet year were only 2,280 units ahead of the month just closed.

Sales of trucks totaled 14,113, a gain of 1,170 units over January, 1939.

Used car sales in January were 118,272 units, a gain of approximately 3,800 over those in January 1939. Used car sales in the final 10 days were especially heavy, exceeding those for the second 10 days by 7,923 units.
