## New System To Choose Commissioners

county, the County Executive Committee of any political party therein shall nominate the candidate of any such party as the nominee to be voted on in such general elections."

From this act to provide for the nomination and election of the County Commissioners, it appears that from now on no one township will be represented by more than one commissioner and at the same time every township will be represented even if a candidate has to be drafted.

This method... the new one... resembles in some degree the custom observed in Perquimans County before the year 1900 when the different townships nominated and elected their own commissioners. The difference now is that the townships only nominate.

For forty years Perquimans County's Board of Commissioners has

been composed of the five men highest in the primaries, regardless of the township represented or whether certain townships were represented on the board at all.

It will certainly call for at least one change in the present board whether the incumbents are opposed or not.
