

MAN COMES AROUND TO INVESTIGATE TIP ON INDISCRIMINATE ALCOHOL SALES

Government Agent Apparently Finds Little Basis For Mysterious Letter Received

Sombody wrote a letter to Washington, D. C., recently. When it was finally directed to the proper department, a Bureau of Investigation Man was sent to Hertford to look over a deplorable situation.

He was supposed to find Any Number of local merchants dealing indiscriminately in rubbing alcohol and Any Number of customers using the stuff for wrong purposes . . . bluntly, to get drunk on.

The Man got here Friday, and lo and behold, several merchants were selling alcohol. Not indiscriminately, but just as they had been selling it for years and years; not bootlegging or selling it under cover, but out in the wide-open right over the counter.

Usually, the rubbing compound is about seventy percent pure alcohol, and one can get very drunk on it; if he lives through it in order to prove it.

It states plainly on the bottle that it is intended for external use only, and that a swill of the stuff is very likely to cause serious gastric disturbances.

So the G-Man, or the T-Man, or whatever he is, went quietly to work. Government men always work quietly.

It seems that since January 20th it is illegal for any merchant, except registered druggists, to buy any more rubbing alcohol. Those other merchants who have it in stock may dispose of it, but they can't buy any more. In fact, they haven't been able to buy any more since January 20th.

It isn't very serious. The demand isn't large, and neither is the profit. Bottles of rubbing alcohol were just items that self-respecting merchants had been dispensing for years and years. The merchants haven't made an issue of it; they hardly noticed it. It didn't seem to make a lot of difference to them whether they sold it or not.

So the G-Man found just exactly what nobody was trying to hide.

But what he didn't find here is a basis for the tip that Somebody sent to Washington saying the stuff was being used for drinking purposes.

1939 Cotton Ginned Here Is 543 Bales Under 1938 Crop

According to a cotton ginning report from Willie M. Harrell, special agent for the Department of Commerce, 1,246 bales of cotton were ginned in Perquimans County and to be ginned from the crop of 1939 prior to March 1, as compared with 1,789 bales from the crop of 1938.

This report does not include cotton grown in Perquimans County that may have been ginned in adjoining counties. Still, it does include cotton that may have been produced in adjoining counties and ginned in Perquimans.
