April 3rd, 10th, 17th—Winslow's Grove, 1:15 p. m.; Nicanor (Ross Baker's Store) 1:45-2 p. m.; Nicanor, 2 p. m.; Bay Branch, 2:30 p. m.

April 4th, 11th, 18th—Belvidere, Community House, 8:30-8:45 a. m.; Cedar Hill, 1 p. m.; Winfall (colored) 1:30 p. m.
