The first of these is to be guided by the fear of God. As Irwin remarks: "This fear is not terror, but that affectionate reverence with which the children of God regard His law; the song, "God Bless America"? hence the appropriateness of the language in Verse 8: "And this spirit lic last in France? of reverence is the primary essential of true wisdom." Thus the fear of the closing of the trade route from God is wisdom because it implies Burma to China? the attitude of wisdom, put one in touch with the source of wisdom and regulates the life of wisdom. None are so foolish as they who ignore instruction and despise wisdom.

The second of these duties is to be guided by the instruction of good parents. This, of course, puts an obligation upon parents to live such lives themselves as to be a proper source of instruction to their children. Granted good parents, who are faithfully trying to exemplify in their lives the spirit of Christ, sons and daughters should hear and heed the advice and instruction given them. Too often today young people regard their parents as old fogies, and their love of God and the things of the church as too old-fashioned for modern living.




