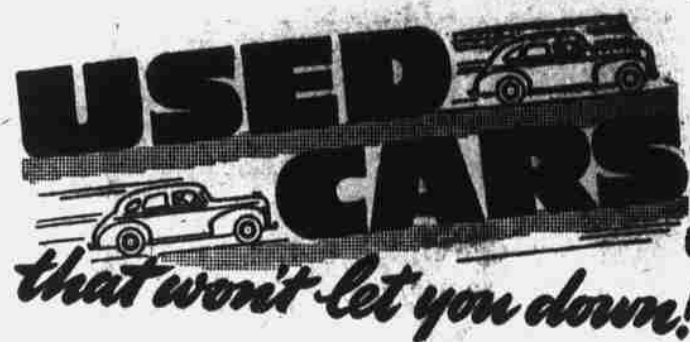
This letting does not include the new road project from the Causeway to the Elmwood Dairy about which there was so much dissension when
