Fertilizer Law **May Be Amended**

Raleigh, N. C., Feb. 27.-Changes in the State Fertilizer Law "to give farmers greater protection, to decrease the use of sand in various grades and simplify information on plant food guarantees," will be sought in the 1941 General Assembly, D. S. Coltrane, assistant to the Commissioner of Agriculture, said today.

He explained that under proposed changes, the number of grades of fertilizer will be reduced and greater use of grades recommended by the N. C. Experiment Station will be promoted.




