Red Cross Sewing Project Receives More Materials

S. M. Whedbee, chairman of the Perquimans Chapter of the Red Cross, announced this week that additional materials had arrived here for the Red Cross sewing project being undertaken by volunteer ladies of Hertford.

The new material that has arrived consists of twenty-five pounds of yarn to be used in making sweaters and 150 yards of unbleached muslin for the making of hospital robes.

Mr. Whedbee stated that the yarn for the sweaters will require the use of a No. 6 needle and asks that all volunteers for the knitting of these sweaters be sure of having the proper needle for the knitting.

Commenting on the progress the ladies are making in the sewing of dresses, Mr. Whedbee said that up to Wednesday a total of 40 dresses had been cut out, and of this number, 20 had been completed and are ready for shipment to Red Cross headquarters.

Persons interested in this work and who would like to aid the Red Cross in supplying clothing for refugees are requested to see either Mr. Whedbee or Mrs. C. P. Morris, as there remains plenty of work yet to be done and all volunteers are welcome to assist.
