U.S. Coast Guard Raises Age Limit

The United States Coast Guard is now accepting applications for enlistment, from young men between the ages of 18 and 28 years. Applicants must be citizens of the United States, of good moral character and meet the physical and educational require-

Base pay for original enlistments is \$21 per month and usually increases to \$36 per month at the end of 4 months in a training school. The average boy is advanced to \$54 per month usually after the end of his first year of service. Each man on his first enlistment is given \$112.75 clothing bounty allowance for uniforms, etc. Enlistments are made for a period of three years.


