

Safety Talks

More bicycle riders were killed in North Carolina the first seven months of this year than were killed during the entire twelve months of last year, the Highway Safety Division reported this week.

Accident records show that 25 bicycle riders met with death on the streets and highways of this state from January through July of this year, an 80 per cent increase over the 14 cyclists killed the first seven months of 1940 and a 25 per cent increase over the total of 20 cyclists killed all last year.

Warning that bicycles are classed as vehicles under the State law, and that cyclists must obey the same general traffic regulations that apply to motor vehicles, Ronald Hocutt, director of the Highway Safety Division, listed the following 12 rules:

- 1. Refrain from "clever" or "stunt" riding.
2. Dismount and walk across dangerous intersections.
3. Keep to the right and close to the edge of the roadway.
4. Learners should ride in a park or other safe place.
5. Ride without wobbling; avoid sharp turns.
6. Say "No" to anyone desiring to ride as a passenger.
7. Never hitch onto a moving vehicle.
8. At night, carry a light in front and either a light or reflector in the rear.
9. Stop for all stop signs.
10. If parcels are carried, strap them to the frame or place in a basket carrier.
11. Avoid crowded streets and heavily traveled highways.
12. Keep yourself and your bike in good condition.
