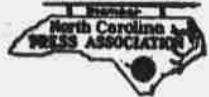

LEGAL NOTICE

An Ordinance Authorizing The Issuance of \$2,000 Bonds of The Town of Hertford, North Carolina, For Repairing Water Tank.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Hertford as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act, 1921, of North Carolina, and amended, negotiable bonds

of the Town of Hertford, North Carolina, are hereby authorized to be issued in an aggregate amount not exceeding \$2,000 for the purpose of repairing water tank. (Water Department).

Section 2. A tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 3. A statement of debt of the Town of Hertford has been filed with the Town Clerk and is open to public inspection.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication unless, in the meantime, a

petition for its submission to the voters is filed under the Municipal Finance Act, 1921, and in such event it shall take effect when approved by the voters at an election as provided in such act.

The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 3rd day of December, 1941, and was first published on the 5th day of December, 1941.

Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication.
