

### John W. Fox Speaks At Achievement Day Program Thursday

#### Annual Reports Submitted By Demonstration Clubs; Tour County

John W. Fox, assistant extension editor of North Carolina State College, spoke to the members of the Perquimans County Home Demonstration Clubs on the occasion of their semi-annual Federation meeting at the Hertford Grammar School on Thursday afternoon.

Mr. Fox spoke instead of F. H. Jeter, extension editor, who was unable to come because of conflicting engagements.

"It is the duty of farm families to feed our own people well, then to feed those who are fighting against the Axis powers," Mr. Fox said.

"Great Britain must have American food to win the war, and our farmers must be made to realize the importance of planting foodstuffs. We should produce these foodstuffs on a large enough scale to feed the soldiers in our army camps," Mr. Fox continued.

Mr. Fox's address followed semi-annual reports made from each of the 13 Perquimans Home Demonstration Clubs.

The reports were made in a novel and interesting manner, no two of which were given in the same way. In each case a stunt, or brief drama, was presented revealing the club statistics and figures in such an interesting manner that the attention of every person present was held during the period.

The program opened shortly after one o'clock, with the entire group singing America, followed by the collect of the club women of America recited in unison.
