Gas For Victory Gardeners Victory gardeners planning to cultivate plots away from their homes will be eligible for extra rations of gasoline this summer, if they can show need for extra mileage, the OPA announced. Mileage rationing regulations are amended to provide up to 300 miles for six months for victory garden travel, if the car owner is: 1. Is regularly cultivating a tract of vegetables 1,500 square feet or more. 2. Cannot get to his garden any other way and shows his labor is necessary to it. 3. Arranges, if possible, to share his car with other gardeners.


