To insure an ample supply of volatile anti-freeze mixtures for passenger cars in 14 Western states before cold weather sets in, WPB has ordered industrial alcohol manufacturers with national distribution to supply specified quotas to the states upon receipt of orders from dealers. Each state will receive a supply equal to one and one-half gallons per passenger car registered. States involved are: Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Kanses, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming.
