U. S. Has Big Wheat Carry-Over

The wheat carry-over in the U.S. on July 1, 1943, was 618 million bushels and for July 1, 1944, is estimated at 300 million bushels, according to the Bureau of Agricultural Economics. This is in sharp contrast to the 40 million for 1918 and 85 millipn for 1919. Large supplies and reduced exports have made available record quantities for feed and industrial alcoholic production in this war.

War Expenditures Increase U. S. war expenditures for November went to a new high of \$7,794,000,-000, an increase of 690 million dollars, or nearly 10 percent, over October, WPB has reported. The average daily rate of expenditures for war purposes was close to the 300-milliondollar mark in November.

More Refrigeration Coming Increased ice refrigerator quotas for the first three months of 1941-40,000 more than for the last quarter of this year-have been set by the War Production Board. This increased production is expected to care for the increased need for ice refrigerators, due to the unavailability of mechanical refrigerators.




