The Elmwood Farms Dairy, owned and operated by B. B. Dawson for the past four years, went out of business two weeks ago.

The cows of the dairy were sold to the Brite Dairy of Elizabeth City, who agreed to furnish milk to J. Oliver White, Hertford milk distributor.

The final closing out of the dairy took place this week when Mr. Dawson held a sale and sold the equipment of his dairy.

### Special Gas Rations For Service Men

As an aid to service men and women who are recovering from illness or wounds received while on active duty, OPA is now issuing special gasoline rations for use in traveling to and from their homes or other places of convalescence.

This action was taken at the request of the War and Navy Departments which said that the use of an automobile may, in some cases, aid greatly in a service man's recovery to health.

The special ration will be issued on presentation of leave papers to a local board—together with a letter from the attending medical officer certifying that transportation by automobile, rather than by other means, will materially assist in the recovery of the person's health.
