

**Food Ration Stamps Valid Indefinitely**

Theodore S. Johnson, Raleigh OPA district director, declared Wednesday that expiration dates for food ration stamps are out for the duration.

Beginning in April, Johnson said, red and blue stamps in War Ration Book No. Four will be good indefinitely.

There will be no change in the way in which stamps become valid. Housewives will continue to get

three red stamps worth 30 points every second Sunday and five blue stamps worth 50 points the first of every month.

Johnson said the change is in line with similar changes in other rationing programs. The expiration date of shoe stamps was removed last September and sugar expiration dates were done away with three weeks ago.
