Kerr Scott Urges Census Cooperation

Agriculture Commissioner Kerr Scott has urged the 300,000 farmers of North Carolina to assist in every way possible the agriculture census employees.

Explaining that facts gathered in the 1945 census of agriculture, which began January 8, will be held in the strictest confidence, Scott said:

"I can assure you that you may feel free to answer any of the questions the census takers ask and that the answers will not be used for any other purposes than for the census. Only sworn census employees will see the records, and these employees will be liable to fine or imprisonment if they tell neighbors or anyone else about individual farm operations."

Referring to the questions asked by the enumerators, Scott said they include queries concerned with crop acreage, production and value of crops, the number of each type of livestock on the farm on January 1, the value of livestock products sold last year, the number of people living on each farm, the number of family workers and hired workers, and the total cash paid in 1944 for farm labor.

"The 1945 census has been set up

so that it will provide more information than ever before on the people who live and work on farms," said Scott.
