**Job Well Done**

This newspaper is proud to publish the news that Perquimans County has achieved honors again during a War Loan campaign. We are happy to congratulate the people of the county for their splendid cooperation with the Government in lending money to help hasten victory over Japan and we extend to the War Finance Committee a salute for a job well done.

Several weeks ago, in fact, from the beginning of the Seventh War Loan, it seemed an almost impossible task to reach the county's Seventh War Loan quota on the sale of E bonds, but this task was accomplished and before any other county in this section had achieved the same goal.

The sale of coupon bonds rolled along at a rapid rate and sales for this type of bond reached as high a figure as the committee could hope for, but the E bond sales lagged for a while, then the people of the county began buying the savings bond in numbers which spelled success for the drive.

Early this week the goal was in sight and a final effort of the War Finance Committee was made to push the sales over the \$130,000 mark, which was double the quota of the last campaign.

At this time of year, when money is usually tied up in farming, purchasing of equipment and the like, this record is truly a great one and every person who had a part in the drive, either by selling or buying bonds has a right to feel proud over the county's record.

It has been another job well done.
