Sgt. William Feild Awarded Bronze Star

15th AAF In Italy—William S. Feild, 25, 22 Dobb Street, Hertford, N. C., has been awarded the Bronze Star for "meritorious achievement in direct support of combat operations and has been promoted to the grade of technical sergeant at his base in the 15th AAF in Italy.

The award was made in recognition of more than a year of service as crew chief on one of the ground maintenance crews in the 461st Bomb Group.

"I have serviced three bombers since I have been overseas," Feild says. "The smoothest plane I have ever had was my second one. She flew 69 sorties while I had her. I certainly hated to see her go."

Prior to coming overseas in March, Feild spent over a year servicing trainer planes at Moody Field, Ga., and Boythville, Ark. He also flew as aerial engineer in a B-24 training squadron at Smyrna, Tenn. He entered the Army October 19, 1938, after attending Perquimans County High School. He re-enlisted in the AAF October 8, 1941, and received specialists training in the B-29 school at Keesler Field, Miss.

His mother, Mrs. Almira Feild, lives at the Hertford address. His brother, Sergeant Charles F. Feild, is stationed at Walla Walla, Wash.
