CIVILIANS AT WAR

The government needs and asks its citizens in this 191st week of the war against Japan to:

- 1. Be ready to answer local calls for help from short-handed farmers. By working with the crop corps you will do your part in assuring adequate food supplies.
2. Take a non-nursing auxiliary hospital job. Hospitals are overcrowded and badly in need of permanent help. Apply at your local hospital.
3. Report all overcharges, however small, to the Price Control board of your ration board. Without this check by individual shoppers, prices cannot be held down. You need not give your name.

Reminders

Meats and fats—Red Stamps Q2 through U2, last day of usage, August 31. Red Stamps V2 through Z2, last day of usage, September 30. Red Stamps A1 through F1, last day of usage, October 31. Red Stamps F1 through K1, last day of usage, November 30.

Processed foods—Blue Stamps Y2, Z2, A1, B1, C1, last day of usage, August 31. Blue Stamps D1 through H1, last day of usage, September 30. Blue Stamps J1 through N1, last day of usage, October 31. Blue Stamps P1 through T1, last day of usage, November 30.

Sugar stamps—36, last day of usage, August 31. Fuel oil—Period 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 coupons, good for ten gallons per unit, continue valid throughout the country for the rest of the heating year. New period 1 coupon in the 1945-46 ration may be used anytime after June 1.

Shoes—Airplane stamps Nos. 1, 2, 3, in Book Three continue valid indefinitely. New shoe stamp (airplane stamp No. 4 in Book Three) will become valid August 1.

Farm Slaughter

A ceiling price has been established for the grading of beef, veal, lamb or mutton by commercial freezer or locker plants for farm slaughters. OPA announced. The ceiling, effective July 30, 1945, is 12 1/2 cents per hundred pounds of meat graded, computed to the next highest multiple of five cents.

For example, a farm slaughterer requests a locker plant to grade a 150-pound cut of meat. The ceiling price for grading this meat would actually figure out at 18 3/4 cents. Adjusted to the next highest five cent multiple, however, the final ceiling price would be 20 cents on this particular operation.

Gas Ration Coupons

Thefts of gasoline ration coupons from service stations have increased to such an extent recently that every station operator should adopt all possible safeguard immediately, OPA says.

Apparently organized gangs of racketeers, who formerly made and distributed counterfeit gasoline ration coupons, have found that their former racket is no longer safe nor profitable and that the markets for their invalid ration coupons have disappeared, OPA adds. As a result, the racketeers have turned to the theft of valid currency from service stations and have been selling coupons at various prices to black market operators.

Tires Set For August

August quotas of 2,500,000 passenger car tires and 386,862 small truck tires for civilian motorists, exactly the same as for July, and a reduced quota of large truck tires were announced by WPB and OPA. The quota of truck tires size 8.25 and larger was cut from 234,308 in July to 200,000 for August.

Where Your War Bond Money Goes It costs about \$500 to fly a wounded man from Okinawa to Pearl Harbor and another \$200 to fly him the additional 2,100 miles to San Francisco, the Navy Department informs the War Finance Division of the Treasury.

Price Rule Changed

Price regulations governing sales and rentals of used mechanical household refrigerators have been amended, effective August 6, OPA said. The following changes are made:

- 1. Control of refrigerator rentals by landlords to tenants is clarified.
2. Refrigerators sold "as is" must have all parts necessary for operation.
3. A consumer selling a used mechanical refrigerator must give a written agreement to pay for all parts and repairs needed to fulfill the guaranty.

All models produced in 1941 and 1942, and all lift top refrigerators, are given dollar-and-cent prices. The \$5 warranty allowance added by the seller on used refrigerators with a one-year guarantee is increased to \$10 on 1939 and 1940 models.

More leather shoes for civilians will be produced during the last three months of this year than in any previous quarter of 1945, because of scheduled military cutbacks, WPB and OPA announced. A production rise of civilian shoes containing leather in the uppers or soles to approximately 26,000,000 pairs per year.
