CATHOLICS PLEDGE TO BOYCOTT INDECENT SHOWS, LITERATURE
Last Sunday, during the Most Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, 21,000,000 (21,000,000 babies unable), 1,000,000 increase by births and converts last year, members of the National Legion of Decency and the National Organization for Decent Literature, sponsored by the Catholic church in the U. S. A., solemnly renewed their following annual pledges, inviting all Catholics and non-Catholics throughout the world to repeat them: "In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost. Amen. I condemn indecent and immoral pictures and those which glorify crime or criminals. I promise to unite with all who protest against them. I acknowledge my obligation to form a right conscience about pictures that are dangerous to my moral life. As a member of the Legion of Decency, I pledge myself to see only good pictures. I promise, further, to stay away altogether from places of amusement which show pictures that can be an occasion of sin. "I further promise that recognizing my obligation of conscience I will not buy or read papers, magazines or books that offend against the virtue of holy purity. Out of love for our Lord, who loves pure souls, I will

prize above all things this beautiful virtue in thought, word and deed. Amen."

Father McCourt, pastor of St. Ann's Catholic church, further stated that Pope Pius XII urged that the rest of the almost 440,000,000 Catholics throughout the world repeat these pledges annually.

Next Sunday in the Edenton church, masses at 7, 9, and 11 a. m., first over in 80 minutes, other two in 45 and including sermon on "Proofs Only Catholic Bishops, Priests Successors

of Apostles," followed immediately by Sunday School and at 8 p. m. by Rosary, Novens in Honor of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal, Week-end Masses; one mass, Rosary.
