

Shetland Pony Farm Attracts Interest

A Shetland pony breeding farm, which has been in operation for several months at the Thornton farm on Route 17, near the Perquimans-Pasquotank line, is attracting much interest from people from all sections of eastern North Carolina, according

to R. H. Gild who is operating the project. Mr. Gild stated that none of the ponies are for sale at the present time, it being the intention of the operators to build up the strain before offering any ponies for sale. The herd numbers 14 head at this time and included in the lot is a mare which has won a number of ribbons at shows. This pony was brought from England. An outstanding pony

is a sire which stands 34 inches high and weighs about 250 pounds, this pony being about two years old. Also, there is one pony 28 years old, which has found 14 colts and has been shown in 42 States and Canada and Mexico.
