

## YOUR COUNTY WELFARE DEPARTMENT

There are many state and some federal agencies which work through a local agency rather than to set up their own local offices. Your County Welfare Department acts as a link between you and many such state and federal agencies.

One example of this is our work with the state hospitals for the mentally ill, situated at Raleigh, Morganton, and Goldsboro. Often we are called upon to write a Social History for the patient who is to be admitted. This history gives the background of the patient and his family, which helps in the diagnosis and treatment for him. When a patient is well enough to be sent home, the hospital quite often asks the Welfare Department to visit the family to be sure that the home conditions are such that the patient would continue to improve. Sometimes we have to help the family make proper plans for the return of their relatives. Such was

the case of Elmer Jones.

Mr. Jones had been in the state hospital for four years and was now well enough to come home. The hospital wanted us to visit his sister to learn whether or not he could live with her for awhile until he got adjusted and found a job.

We found that Mr. Jones' sister was the wife of a prominent farmer in the community. Mrs. Jones was not very anxious to talk about Mr. Jones. She felt that he was naturally bad tempered and crazy, and that she and her husband would be unable to care for a man who had lost his reasoning powers as had her brother. We explained to her that one who is insane is simply sick in his mind and in many cases can be cured as well as someone who is physically ill.

After our conversation with Mrs. Jones and her husband they decided to let Mr. Jones visit them for two weeks with the idea of staying longer if things worked satisfactorily. The hospital brought Mr. Jones home with the promise to take him back if necessary.

When Mr. Jones arrived Mr. and Mrs. Jones realized that he was much better and arranged for him to make his home with them and help on the farm. We made several visits to the home to be sure that everything was going well before terminating the case.

Then there is the Caswell Training School, which works on much the same basis as our state hospital for the mentally ill. This school usually accepts white children between the ages of six and twenty-one years of age. Three types of mentally deficient patients are accepted here: the idiot, the imbecile, and the moron.

The latter type of patient is the one who can be trained to do many useful tasks, and may eventually learn a trade whereby he can become self-supporting. This type of feeble-minded person needs to be safeguarded from exploitation by unscrupulous persons who often use them as tools in crime and, therefore, they are better off in a controlled environment.

The committing agency for Caswell is your County Welfare Department. After the application for admittance has been completed it is approved by the Superintendent of Public Welfare, and is forwarded to Caswell. Often information on the social and economic situation is needed, and again your Welfare Department is called upon to make the requested investigation.

Here are two more ways in which we render services to you and your neighbors regardless of your need or lack of need of financial aid.

### Handling Determines Profits In Potatoes

Realizing that the handling of Irish potatoes in harvesting and marketing makes a difference of several hundred thousand dollars yearly to North Carolina growers and dealers, potato men in the Mt. Olive-Calypto-Faison area are sponsoring paid newspaper advertising to acquaint producers with proper handling methods at the outset of the 1946 harvest season which began this week.

H. L. Meacham, marketing expert of the State College Extension Service, has rounded up the recommendations of the state's leading marketing, horticulture and pathology specialists and lists seven suggestions for potato harvest which will add thousands of hard-earned dollars to crop profits:

- (1) Handle crop carefully to prevent scuffing or bruising, both in the field, at loading and shipping points;
- (2) Pick the crop promptly. Tightly woven bags—or if possible, field crates—should be used, limiting the weight of each bag to 40 pounds;
- (3) Cover bags or crates with canvas tarpaulin because sun and wind cause severe damage to potatoes;
- (4) Do not allow crop to heat. If

potatoes do heat for any reason, leave them overnight for early morning picking.

(5) Stacked potatoes, stored prior to grading or loading, should be arranged so as to allow the free circulation of air through the stack;

(6) Use pyramid type of loading in car with good padding between bottom layer of potatoes and car floor;

(7) Do not load known disease-carrier potatoes with healthy lots.

### Record Cover Crops Planned For State

Agronomist Roy L. Lovvorn of the State College Extension Service has reported that North Carolina's farmers plan record planting of cover crops next fall and reminded that farmers who set aside definite acreages of these crops for seed will have the upper hand in supplying the expected fall demand for good seed.

A record production of food crops also is in prospect as indicated by the fact that to date 87 per cent of the state's 244,000 farm operators have signed requests for assistance through the Agricultural Conservation program this year.

It is expected that more than 15,000,000 pounds of seed will be planted to winter cover crops this year as farmers seek to add depleted nitrogen to the soil and protect it through the winter. Prospects are that 280,000 acres will be seeded to Austrian winter peas, 40,000 acres to vetch, 117,000 acres to crimson clover, and 68,000 acres to rye grass.

The state was able to use but 78 per cent of its soil conservation assistance allotment in 1945 because of a ruling which tagged funds as non-transferable, preventing the reallocation of money from cropland even though it was not in cultivation. A more flexible plan of conservation assistance has been provided this year and PMA leaders say that it will permit the use of "every penny" of the \$6,301,000 allocated for the rejuvenation of farmland, dissipated by wartime production. Farmers must file conservation assistance requests prior to June 1.

The quantity and variety of winter cover crop seed which will be made available under the 1946 conservation program will be announced at an early date, Lovvorn said.
