served a chicken salad plate before returning for a third progression of bridge.

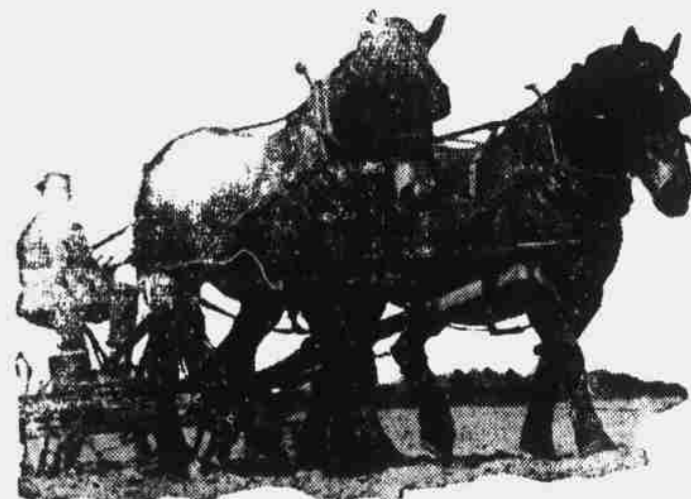
