**Criminal Calendar Concluded Wed. P. M.**

guilty of simple assault in the Shambry case, in which the two defendants were charged with assault with a deadly weapon and carrying concealed weapons. A motion by Attorney W. H. Oakley, Jr., that the verdict be set aside was overruled by Judge Morris, who continued prayer for judgment upon payment of the costs

of the court.  
A plea of nolo contendere was entered in the case charging Horace Lee Jordan, Negro, with reckless driving, hit and run and injury to individuals. Upon completion of the testimony offered by the State, Judge Morris sentenced Jordan to prison for a term of 2 to 4 years, suspended upon payment of a sum of \$150 for the use of Audrey Smith, \$700 for the use of Kenneth Turner and the costs of the case. Jordan was placed on probation for a period of five years and ordered not to operate a car during that period.  
Testimony was closed in the case of Thurman Jones, charged with reckless driving and driving under the influence at about noon Wednesday. The jury returned a verdict of guilty to a charge of reckless driving, but failed to reach an agreement on the count of driving under the influence. Judge Morris ordered Jones to pay a fine of \$25 and costs and the State took a nolo pross on the charge of driving drunk.

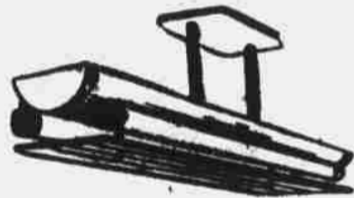
