

Extension Worker To Leave Position At First Of Year

B. Troy Ferguson, Northeastern District agent for the State College Extension Service, has requested retirement as of January 1, 1948 following thirty-two years of continuous service in Agricultural Extension, Director I. O. Schaub of State College, has announced.

Mr. Ferguson is a native of the Hickory Mountain section of Chatham County and was graduated from State College in the class of 1908. For a brief period he taught school in his home community and with the passage of the Smith-Lever Act, establishing Agricultural Extension in North Carolina, was appointed county farm agent of Pitt County. After service in Pitt from June 1, 1915 until December 31, 1917, Mr. Ferguson was transferred to Wilson County and worked there until June 1, 1925.

He was then promoted to district farm agent for the whole of eastern Carolina. The territory was later divided into the Northeastern and Southeastern districts and Mr. Ferguson retained charge of the Northeastern District of 21 counties. He has continued in that position until this time. He has a twenty-year certificate of service to North Carolina farming issued by the National Extension Fraternity, Epsilon Sigma Phi. He is a member of the Raleigh Rotary Club and on the Board of Stewards of Edenton Street Methodist Church.

For 32 years he has served the State without a break, except for a brief vacation each year. During that period he has selected and worked with 168 county farm agents and he has seen the northeastern section of the State become one of the great

crop empires of the Nation. Mr. Ferguson is noted for his patient dealing and for his careful planning in agricultural work. "I have worked", he says simply, "for the uplift of humanity in my section of the State. Pitt County alone sells 20 million dollars worth of tobacco a year from its farms and we have tried to guide this farming activity so that it might serve all the people best. We have tried to translate some of the annual cash income into better living for all the people."

The Fergusons will retain their residence in Raleigh when his retirement request becomes effective December 31. They have one son, engaged in the advertising business in New York City. Otherwise there is no other family and Mr. and Mrs. Ferguson say they will do some of the things they have long wanted to do but so far have not had the time. Director Schaub said yesterday that Mr. Ferguson's request has been granted. In accepting it the Director said, "You have been a faithful and dependable servant of the people and we shall have a hard time finding one so unselfish and devoted to duty."

County Agent Advises Local Poultry Raisers

Poultry raisers in Perquimans County are advised this week by I. C. Yagel, County Agent, to plan with care the production of grain crops to feed local flocks as a remedy to the short corn crop and the shortage of other small grain, which is foreseen due to exports to foreign countries.

Mr. Yagel stated the poultryman's best solution to these shortages is to plant as much small grain as is possible and practical this fall. This production will offset the high costs of purchasing grain for poultry. He also advised poultrymen to make the best use of every pound of feed, not to feed culls, rats, lice, etc.

Careful inspection of the flock will weed out the culls and any birds that are too thin or light in weight for

food. Birds that are lame or blind should be removed from the flock at once. The County Agent also urged the examination of flocks for lice and advised treatment for same in order to increase the value of the birds and to halt any reduction in egg production.

Army Plan Offers Youths Education

Thousands of high school graduates throughout the nation are assuring themselves of an expert education in the field of aviation by taking advantage of the United States Air Force's new aviation career plan, M/Sgt. C. B. Cayton, commanding officer of the U. S. Army and Air Force Recruiting Service for Hertford and Edenton, said today.

Since the plan was announced early

this summer, many youths in the states of North and South Carolina have joined the USAF to receive technical training in a wide variety of specialties ranging from radar fundamentals to jet airplane and engine mechanics.

The new plan, according to Sergeant Cayton, enables a young man to choose, before enlisting, three technical schools offering training in which he is interested. If qualified, he is assured of being sent to one of these schools after completing basic training. Former service men are assigned directly to the school of their choice.

Any high school graduate between 17 and 34 years of age is eligible to apply. So are non-high school graduates if they can document the equivalent education.

Young men who desire training under the aviation career plan may enlist for three, four or five years. Those showing ability and leadership and who are otherwise qualified are eligible to apply for officer candidate school or for flying training as aviation cadets.

Young men, or their parents, who are interested in obtaining full details of the new aviation career plan should contact the local Army and Air Force recruiting sergeant each Thursday at the Post Office in Edenton or the recruiting office located at 202 Kramer Building, Elizabeth City.

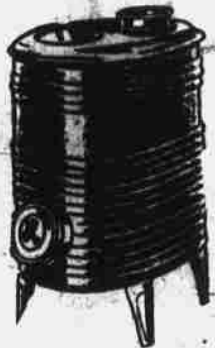

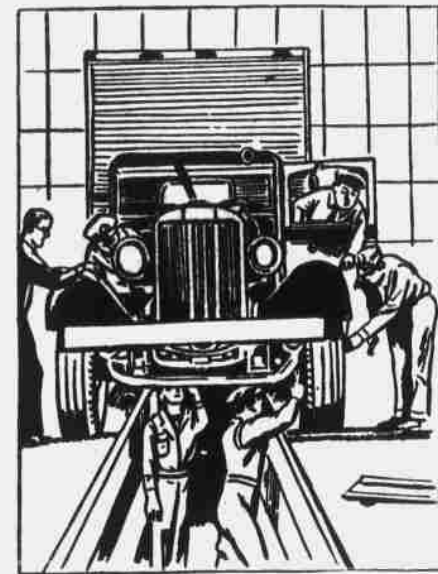
