MINNIE WILSON'S MEET

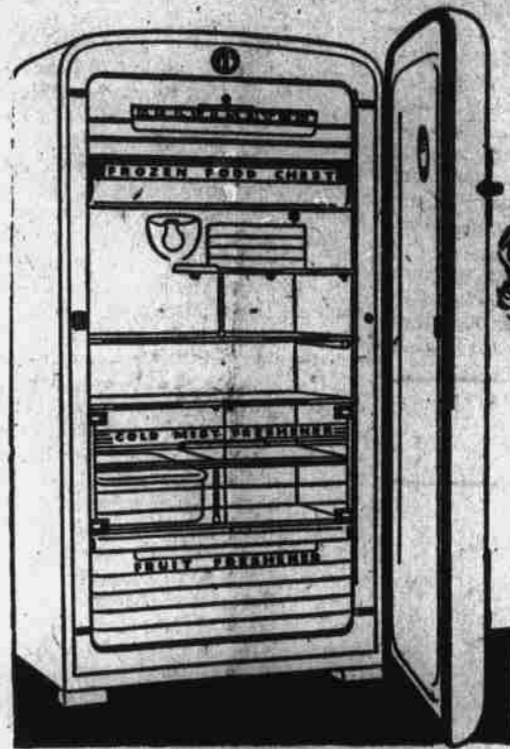
