

Vets' Question Box

Q—When I was discharged from the Army two years ago, I was advised by Veterans Administration to enter job training under Public Law 16. Due to conditions beyond my control, I was unable to enter training at that time. Is it possible for me to enter training now?

A—In all probability, you can enter training now, but you should contact your nearest Veterans Administration office where your first advisement will be reevaluated for you.

Q—I dropped my \$10,000 National Service Life Insurance term policy and later reinstated only \$5,000 of it. Is it possible for me to reinstate the other \$5,000 at this late date?

A—Yes. You have until July 31, 1948, to reinstate without physical examination if you certify that your health is as good as when the policy lapsed. You need pay only two monthly premiums.

Q—I am going to school under the Vocational Rehabilitation Act (Public Law 16) and would like to know what medical treatment is available to me?

A—Under the Vocational Rehabilitation Act, you are entitled to any type of medical treatment needed to prevent the interruption of your training.

Q—I am a veteran of the last war, but while in service I did not take advantage of National Service Life Insurance. May I file application and get National Service Life Insurance now?

A—Yes, but you will be required to pass a physical examination.

Q—How are places of job-training approved under the G-I Bill and how does a veteran find out what establishments are approved?

A—Training establishments are approved by State approving agencies for job-training under the Servicemen's Readjustment Act (G-I Bill). All VA offices maintain a list of approved establishments in the area in which they are located.

Q—My employer has dismissed me from my job-training position and I would like to know what I can do so that I can continue to receive subsistence?

A—Your training status was terminated and your subsistence allowance ceased when your employer dismissed you. It is now up to you to seek another place of employment with an approved on-the-job training program.

Extracts From the Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Hertford, North Carolina, Held at 7:00 O'clock P. M., on April 12, 1948.

Commissioners Present: W. H. Harcastle, B. C. Berry, M. J. Gregory, H. C. Sullivan and Mayor V. N. Darden.

Commissioners Absent: None. Mr. W. H. Harcastle introduced the following bond ordinance which

was read at length: **ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING \$3,300 WATER BONDS OF THE TOWN OF HERTFORD, NORTH CAROLINA, FOR REPAIRING WATER TANK**
 Be It Ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Hertford as follows:
 Section 1. Pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act, 1921, of North Carolina, as amended, negotiable bonds of the Town of Hertford, North Carolina, are hereby authorized to be issued in an aggregate amount not exceeding \$3,300.00 for the purpose of repairing water tank (Water Department).
 Section 2. A tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds shall be annually levied and collected.
 Section 3. A statement of debt of the Town of Hertford has been filed with the Town Clerk and is open to public inspection.
 Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under the Municipal Finance Act, 1921, and in such event it shall take effect when approved by the voters of the Town of Hertford at an election as provided in said act.
 The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 12th day of April, 1948, and was first published on the 11th day of June, 1948.
 Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication.
