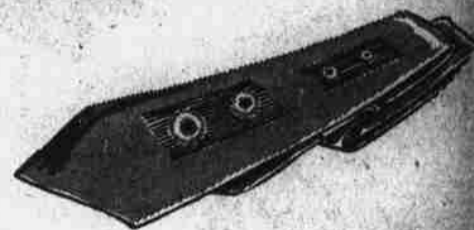

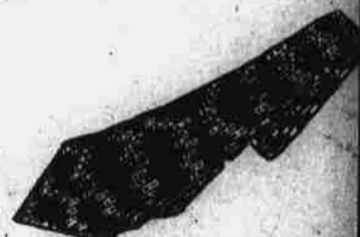
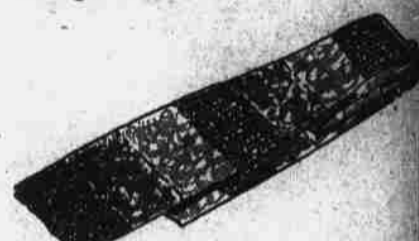
HOSTESS TO BRIDGE CLUB

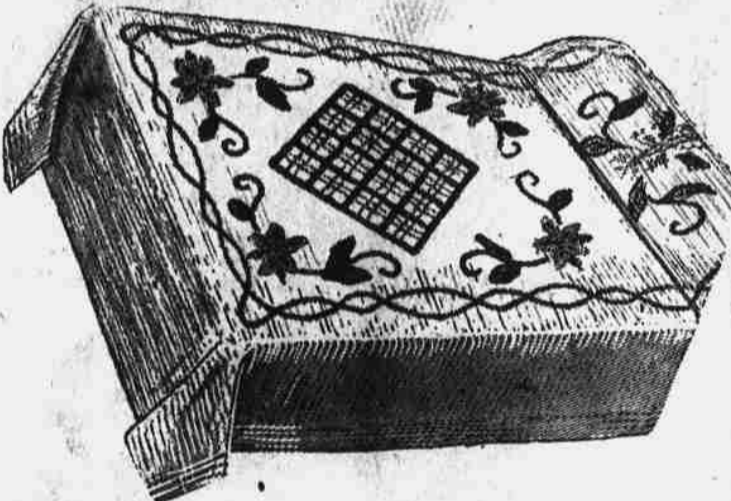

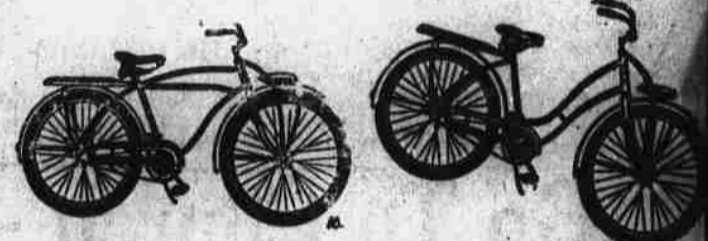
