

Temperance Board Releases Report

The Board of Temperance of the North Carolina Conference of the Methodist Church recently released a report on the 1948 session held at Greenville.

Opening the report with a strong stand, which the Methodist Church has always fostered, against the manufacture and sale of intoxicating beverages the Board went on record deploring the increase in the sale of beer, wine and whiskey and the evils that are caused therefrom; it affirmed the endorsement of the Allied Church League! opposed the advisement of liquor and beer and called upon the 1949 General Assembly of the State to enact a statute prohibiting the manufacture, sale, and transportation of intoxicating beverages.

The Board also went on record calling for development of sentiment against liquor traffic; urging that instruction in public schools and church schools be used to further further this project.

It also called upon the General Assembly, providing that group failed to enact a statute against manufacture, sale and transportation of alcoholic beverages to submit the question to the people of the State through a State-wide referendum.

The report beseeched pastors of the various churches not to recommend or approve for membership on the Board of Stewards, officer or teacher of Sunday School for any official position of the church any person who manufactures, sells, advertises, buys, drinks or votes for beer, wine or whiskey.

MINUTES OF MEETING BOARD OF EDUCATION

The Board of Education met in regular session Monday, January 10, 1949, in the office of the secretary. Mrs. Fernald was absent. Chairman W. E. Dill presided.

Minutes of the preceding meeting were read and approved.

Financial statement of agriculture building at Perquimans County Training School was presented by King Williams, G. A. Polson and J. M. Spruill. (Copy attached to minutes.) Motion was made, seconded, and passed, authorizing payment of note for \$170.00 to the Hertford Banking Company for money borrowed by veterans in construction of agriculture building.

The Board discussed the consolidation of Winslow Grove and Nicanor Schools. This consolidation was formally approved. Superintendent was

authorized to advertise the Winslow Grove building for sale.

Brief review of expenditures to date in the county school budget was presented by the Superintendent. He stated that the expenditures item 641, "repairs to building and grounds", would probably exceed the budget for that particular item, but that total expenditures would be kept within the budget for fiscal year.

A request from Mrs. Pauline J. Bateman, of Columbia, N. C., for damage caused to her car by a school bus on April 27, 1948, was presented and discussed. After considering evidence as passed on to the Board by the investigating officer, a motion was made, seconded, and passed, recommending that Mrs. Bateman be

awarded \$25.00 for damage to her car.

The Superintendent was instructed to secure state contract price on one and one-half ton truck for county maintenance purposes.

The Board authorized Superintendent to permit the colored school to close April 22 for state meeting, provided the day was made up at close of school.

The Board authorized Superintendent to have power voltage checked at the Perquimans County Central School.
