### Be Sure To Vote

Tomorrow, June 4, citizens of North Carolina will have an opportunity, through an election, to express their opinions in regard to a major governmental operation, as proposed by the administrative element of our State government.

This election is being held for the purpose of determining whether or not the citizens of North Carolina favor placing themselves in debt for \$200,000,000 in order to expedite the construction of secondary roads throughout the State, and \$25,000,000 for building school houses.

We believe that our position in regards to these issues are clear, but we repeat to our readers that we are against the proposed \$200,000,000 road bond proposal, BUT, are for the issuance of \$25,000,000 for school buildings.

As we have stated, we believe that it is unnecessary to borrow such a sum of money as 200 million dollars to construct our secondary roads; it is our conviction that this program can be carried out successfully during the next four to eight years on estimated revenue which will be available. We firmly believe that our State Government should instigate a road building program on a pay-as-you-go basis, and save the taxpayers of North Carolina the millions of dollars in interest charges, which the people will be burdened with in the event money is borrowed for the purpose.

We also stand opposed to any increase in the tax on gasoline, which automatically becomes effective in the event the road bond issue is voted by the people. Reports show that the national average tax on gasoline is today 4.37 cents per gallon. North Carolina's motorists will pay 8.75 cents per gallon if the majority of voters favor the borrowing of this 200

million dollars for roads. This election tomorrow is an important one, and it affects every citizen of the State. The outcome of the election will affect you whether you vote or not and because the issues involved may be so far reaching in years to come we urge every eligible voter to cast his ballot on the questions.

### Negro Youth Expects \$125 Profit On Pigs

Marvin Cherry, member of the Martin County Negro "pig chain," expects to realize a profit of at least \$125 on the first litter of pigs farrowed by his gilt, according to R. M. Edwards, Negro county agent for the State College Extension Service.

The litter contains 10 pigs. At nine weeks of age they weighed 464 pounds, the largest one tipping the scales at 51 pounds.

Cherry has had the gilt 10 months.

He feels that he is very fortunate to own a sow worth more than \$100 and be able to sell \$125 worth of pigs in 11 months.

The Martin youth will return two pigs to the chain. His only expense in raising the litter has been buying protein supplement. The total feed bill for the sow and the pigs, excluding home-grown feeds, has been \$37.60.
