

**MINUTES OF MEETING
BOARD OF EDUCATION**

The Board of Education met for the September meeting held September 2, 1949, at 7:30 P. M. All members were present. Mr. Julian White, chairman, presided.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The committee investigating cost of lots and moving houses on property adjoining Hertford High School reported some progress had been made but a full report would be made later.

Motion made, seconded and passed to accept whatever bid is placed on Oak Hill School property on September 3, 1949.

The committee appointed to meet with the architect and State Planning Committee reported that an agreement had been reached with respect to plans for the gymnasium and agriculture building and that the architect should soon have final drawings ready to present for approval. The secretary explained the procedure and forms necessary to complete the survey and application for State school building funds.

In compliance with (S. B. 343) Chapter 115 of the General Statutes of North Carolina which directs that "The County Board of Education of all county administrative units shall, by proper resolution duly recorded, appoint a treasurer of all special school funds for each individual school in the administrative unit," the following are hereby appointed treasurers of individual schools:

The Board unanimously approved the election of Elizabeth L. Byrd of Edenton as a helping teacher for the Negro schools.

Superintendent reported that he had been unable to find a qualified person who would accept the position as helping teacher in the white schools. He will continue to look for a qualified person for another six weeks.

Superintendent was instructed to investigate the possibilities of a blanket insurance policy for all children in Perquimans County. A committee composed of Mr. White, Mrs. Cooke, Mr. Caddy and Mr. Biggers was appointed to pass on the insurance proposition.

Superintendent was instructed to discuss with principals ways and means of improving lunch rooms in the county schools.

**Moisture Factor
In Corn Yields**

Since much of the State's corn was blown down in recent storms, many farmers entered in the State corn contest will need to harvest their crop early or obtain an early estimate of

the yield, according to Dr. E. R. Collins, in charge of agronomy extension at State College.

In general corn is still too wet for accurate estimates of yields to be made, Dr. Collins says. However, he adds, field estimates can be made early provided a moisture determination is made on the samples weighed.

Where a local moisture tester is not available, the grower may obtain a free moisture test by sending at least one pint of shelled corn, in a sealed container, to Dr. Paul H. Harvey, State College, Raleigh.

Acres entered in the State contest can be harvested early provided one of the following methods is used:

(1) Dry all the corn in a commercial dryer before weighing, and determine the shelling percentage and moisture. The corn should be sealed in the dryer by the county contest committee, and weighed by the committee after it is dry.

(2) Weigh the corn wet. Dry 100 or more pounds to a reasonable moisture content before determining the shelling percentage and moisture. This will give a factor for correcting to shelled corn with 15.5 per cent moisture.
