Recorder's Court Hears Eight Cases

Eight cases were disposed of in Perquimans Recorder's Court this week when seven defendants entered pleas of guilty and one defendant was found guilty on a charge of reckless driving.

Clifton Johnson, Negro, paid a fine of \$25 and costs of court on a charge of driving without a license.

Sidney Bergen plead guilty to a charge of speeding and paid a fine of \$10 and costs of court.

William Boyce entered a plea of guilty to a charge of driving drunk and paid a fine of \$100 and costs.

Joseph Riddick, Negro, was fined \$35 and costs of court on a charge of driving without a license and possessing non tax paid liquor.

Felix Hopkins paid a fine of \$25 and cost on a charge of driving without a license.

Andy Walker, Negro, was given a 90 day road sentence suspended upon payment of a fine of \$100 and costs after pleading guilty to a charge of driving drunk.

Willie Lizzie, Negro, was sentenced to the roads for 30 days, suspended upon payment of a fine of \$25 and costs, on a charge of driving without a license.

A verdict of guilty was returned in the case of James Foreman, Negro, charged with reckless driving. Foreman was given 60 days on the roads, suspended upon payment of \$400 for damages to a car owned by Raymond Layden and costs of court. An appeal to the superior court was noted in this case and appeal bond was set at \$500.
