1. Choose a small tree, instead of a big one. It will be just as pretty and much less hazardous.
 2. Keep your tree outdoors until just before Christmas. Install it in the coolest part of the room, away from fireplaces, heaters or radiators.
 3. Do not, under any circumstances, use cotton or paper on the tree or around the tree for decoration.
 4. Do not place electric trains around the tree.

5. Do not use old or worn lights. Use Christmas tree lighting outfits which have been tested by Underwriters Laboratories, Inc. These can be identified by a tag bearing the name of Underwriters Laboratories, Inc., attached to the wires.
 6. Do not plug or unplug the electric cords beneath the tree. Provide a switch some distance from the tree to turn the light off or on.
 7. Do not leave lights burning when no one is in the house. From time to time inspect the tree to see whether any needles near the lights have started to turn brown. If so, change the position of the lights.
 8. When the needles start falling, take the tree down and discard it.

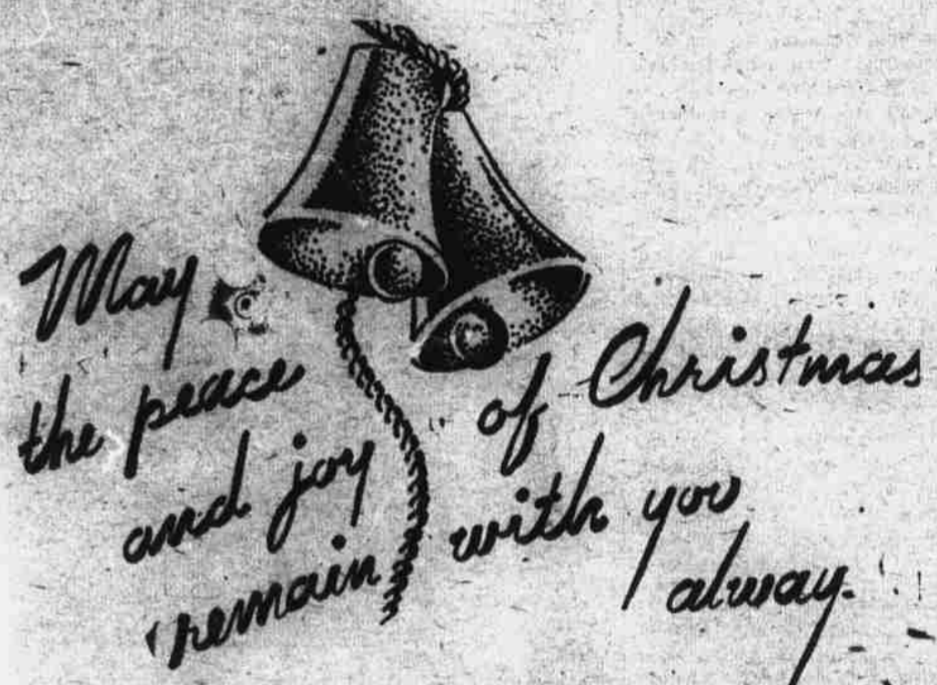
