Road Commission Manages Network

Engineering staff consisting of engineers who handle equipment, maintenance, construction, roadway planning, bridges, statistics and planning, materials and testing and roadbuilding activities in ten highway divisions. All subordinate positions of an engineering nature come under the authority of these department heads. Heading administrative departments are a general counsel, an auditor, director of safety, purchasing and prisons and two administrative assistants to the chairman, one for personnel and the other for public relations.

The Commission derives its income from automobile use taxes and federal aid, especially the gasoline tax, but the expenditure of these funds comes under the careful scrutiny of the Legislature, the Budget Bureau and the personnel department. Each biennium the Legislature authorizes the expenditure of certain funds for road construction, improvement and maintenance. Each expenditure must be approved, as it is made, by the Budget Bureau, and this strict supervisory system effectively safeguards the management of a budget which reached \$85,201,539.70 during the 1948-49 fiscal year.
